Recipe

This lovely summery dessert would work just as well with other seasonal soft fruits. Try raspberries, blackberries or stewed gooseberries.



Ingredients

- 4kg/9lb
- 750g/1lb 10oz [icing sugar](#)
- 400g/14oz [caster sugar](#)
- 2 litres/3½ pints [double cream](#)
- 3 litres/3½ pints plain [yoghurt](#)

Method

1. Place a third of the strawberries in a food processor with the icing sugar and blend to make a purée. You may have to do this in batches.
2. Chop the remaining fruit and place in a large bowl, sprinkle over the caster sugar and set aside.
3. Whip the cream in a very large bowl until soft peaks have formed then stir in the yoghurt, chopped strawberries and the purée.
4. Spoon into large bowls and refrigerate until ready to serve.

The potting shed



April is a busy month as spring takes hold and preparation for summer needs to get underway in earnest. It is time to apply a layer of mulch around your perennials, trees and shrubs before the hot weather arrives. Use organic matter such as well rotted manure to give your plants a nutrient boost as it decomposes. Alternatively an inorganic mulch such as gravel will suppress weeds and keep the moisture in without feeding.

Plant summer-flowering bulbs such as [Lilies](#), [Gladiolus](#) and [Alliums](#) into beds, borders and containers to provide a blush of virtually guaranteed colour over the warm summer months. Don't forget to plant lilies deep to keep them cool and moist.

If any of your garden plants will need supporting this year, put the supports in now so the plants grow up through them. Adding supports afterwards is difficult and may damage the plant. Most established perennials will need some support to keep the foliage from suppressing other nearby plants.

Deadhead daffodils and tulips as the flowers finish but leave the foliage intact allowing it to die back naturally, this way the plants continue to feed the build meaning they will be plump and firm to provide a good flower next year and avoid rotting if you leave them in the ground.

Leeks need to be sown by the first week of April for autumn harvest. Sow directly into a seed bed, or into modules where they can be grown on in a cold frame to be planted out in their final positions in May and June.

There is still time to sow tender vegetables such as tomatoes and sweetcorn under cover, to give them a head start, if you fancy peppers or aubergines the required season is somewhat longer and a plug plant might be a better option at this time of year. Plant them out in the garden after the last frosts.
